# PNG Standards for Drinking Water

- A1 Maximum allowable concentrations from PNG Public Health (Drinking Water) Regulation, Schedule 2, 1984. Values stated are the maximum permissible levels.
- <sup>A2</sup> Jacksons Turbidity Unit (JTU).
- A3 Aesthetically based value.
- A4 Not more than 30 mg/L, if sulphate values exceed 250 mg/L.
- <sup>A5</sup> Chlorinated water or disinfectant water supplies entering the distribution system.
- A6 For water in the distribution system:
  - Throughout any year, 90% of the sample shall not contain any coliform organisms in any sample of 100 mL.
  - There shall be no E. coli in any sample of 100 mL.
  - No sample shall contain more than 10 coliform organisms per 100 mL.
- <sup>A7</sup> Coliform organisms should not be detected in both or any of two consecutive 100-mL samples.
